Football Rex Norris

Football University could not find a better coach to lead its defensive line training. With over 45 years of coaching, most of it coaching defensive linemen, Coach Rex Norris brings his considerable expertise and experience to FBUI.

Norris knows all different levels of defensive line play, from private prep tutoring, to the collegiate level, to the NFL. Norris was at Oklahoma with Barry Switzer where he was the DL coach and eventually assistant head coach. He coached seven first-team All-Americans with the Sooners, including future Hall of Famer Lee Roy Selmon and 14 other 1st round NFL draft choices.

Norris made other college stops at Arizona State, Florida, Tennessee and Texas. In the NFL, he coached the defensive lines for the Denver Broncos, Detroit Lions, Tennessee Titans/Houston Oilers, and Chicago Bears.

After moving to Horseshoe Bay he's been with the Toronto Argonauts, NFL Europe (Amsterdam Admirals), the UFL's Omaha Nighthawks.



Football Blaise Winter

Blaise overcame serious speech and hearing problems to become MVP in football at Syracuse and went on to forge an 11 year career in the NFL with the Chargers, Colts, and Packers, finishing with a Super Bowl Ring with the Packers. Since leaving the game of football, Blaise has inspired thousands of people with his personal story of triumph over adversity. He travels throughout the country speaking to groups and sharing the secret to his success.

Blaise's story is one of hope and encouragement that will motivate us to accept the notion that limitations don't exist. In addition to a Motivation Session, he will speak on "Hand Combat for Football", by offering game changing ways to use the hands. "Mind-Set of Success", a nationally recognized presentation (ESPN/Sports Illustrated/HBO/USA Today) will give new life to old words. He was extremely well received here in 2001 and 2011.



Football Steve Crosby

Steve Crosby attended Pawnee Rock HS before embarking on an All-America career as a running back at Fort Hays State. He was a two-time NAIA All-American and a three-time All Conference choice. In 1974, the New York Giants selected Crosby in the NFL Draft.

Crosby played three seasons with the Giants before retiring due to a career-ending knee injury. In 1977, Crosby joined the Miami Dolphins as a scout and later as coach on Don Shula's coaching staff, one that won an AFC title in 1982 and faced the Washington Redskins in Super Bowl XVII.

Crosby spent 35 years in the NFL including three seasons as a player, four as a scout and 28 as a coach. He is a rare breed among NFL coaches who have been coordinators at multiple positions. Crosby was offensive coordinator for the Atlanta Falcons in 1983-1984 and 1986 and in Cleveland for Bill Belichick in 1994-1995. He has been a Quarterback, Running Backs, Wide Receivers or Tight End Coach at various teams in the NFL. He was honored as the 2007 NFL Special Teams Coach of the Year.



Volleyball Monica Trainer

After playing and graduating from San Jose State University, Monica Hayes-Trainer traveled to Europe to play professional volleyball in Switzerland and Italy. Upon returning to the United States, Monica was hired by Sue Gozansky at University of California, Riverside, to be the assistant coach to the soon to be 1986 Division II National Champions. Monica remained at UCR for 24 years, moving with the program to NCAA Division I. Monica retired from competing after a debilitating knee injury in 2003, though is hoping to make a come-back someday soon!

Monica is currently teaching and coaching at Riverside City College and has placed her team in the top 25 in the state of California during the last 4 out of 5 seasons. She teaches Nutrition, Lifeguard Training, Water Safety Instruction, CPR/First Aide and numerous activity courses.



Basketball Mark Amaral

A veteran coach, who is well respected on the West Coast, Mark Amaral is in his second season as the associate head coach for the Pepperdine men's basketball program. Mark started his coaching career at the NAIA level in the mid 90's. He assisted at Carroll for two seasons, Lewis-Clark State for one and Montana Tech for three.

He was named the 2000 NWAACC Northern division Coach of the Year.

Coach Amaral then spent seven seasons as an assistant coach at UC Santa Barbara under Bob Williams. USBC won its first-ever Big West Conference title in 2002, and advanced to the NCAA tournament. In 2003, the Gauchos won the Big West regular season title and played in the NIT.

He also spent two seasons each at Colorado State and Cal Poly.



Basketball Chris Wright

Widely regarded as one of the top up-and-coming coaches on the West Coast, Chris Wright recently finished his third season as the head coach at Fresno Pacific. He has posted an overall record of 56-36, and led the team to 20 wins in two out of his three seasons at the helm.

In seven years at Fresno Pacific, Wright has helped the Sunbirds compile 139 wins and has been a part of five of the best eight seasons in the program's history.

In 2012-2013 Wright led FPU to a second-place finish in the 14-team Pacific West Conference marking the team's inaugural season in NCAA Division II. The Sunbirds led the conference in scoring (88 points per game).

In 2008-2009 the Sunbirds won a school-record 26 games while convincingly winning the Golden State Athletic Conference regular season title. In 2009-2010 the Sunbirds went 25-9, good enough for the second best record in school history. FPU advanced to the "Sweet Sixteen" of the NAIA National Tournament. The Sunbirds reached as high as #3 in the national rankings.

Basketball Daron Park

Daron Park is the first male head coach in Cal State Fullerton women's basketball history. A native of Great Falls and a MSU graduate, Park's journey to his current position is impressive. Beginning his collegiate coaching career at NAIA Westminster College, Park served as the head coach for 4 years.

During the 2007-08 season Park served as the interim head coach at University of Maryland where he led the Terrapins to a 33-4 overall record and a 13-1 mark in the ACC, including a trip to the NCAA Tournament's Elite Eight round.

At Louisiana Tech, he led the Lady Techsters to two consecutive 20-win seasons and two straight NCAA berths, including a WAC Tournament Championship. As California's associate head coach, he helped the Golden Bears to a NCAA Tournament appearance.

During 9 seasons coaching at the Division I level, his teams appeared in 7 NCAA tournaments, taking three trips to the Elite Eight and securing one WNIT bid during that span. Park's teams have collected an overall record of 219-85 (.720).



Track & Field Dennis Mitchell

Dennis Mitchell, a 15-time Mid-American Conference COY, is in his 18th season at the University of Akron. In the past seven years alone, Mitchell has guided UA to 15 Mid-American Conference Championships, while producing 25 All-Americans, earning 54 All-American honors. A former pole vaulter on the 1985 Abilene Christian University NCAA Division II National Championship team, Mitchell is widely regarded as one of the top vault coaches in the nation.

He assisted at Texas (6 yrs) and North Carolina (4 yrs). North Carolina won ACC outdoor crowns each year, sandwiched around an indoor championship in 1995. UNC's women followed a 1992 ACC outdoor team championship with indoor-outdoor conference sweeps for the next 3 seasons, 1993-95.

Mitchell is currently involved at the national level with USA Track and Field and the US Track and Field Coaches Association.



Track & Field Rahn Sheffield

Nationally-renowned Rahn Sheffield is in his second season as the T&F assistant coach at MSU at Moorhead in 2012-13.

During his coaching career, Sheffield has been honored with COY nine times. His athletes have accumulated awards including 2010 Indoor World Championships three gold medalist; gold, silver and bronze medalists at the 2006 World Jr. Championships in Beijing, China; 2004 Olympic Games Finalist in 400m hurdles; 2003 World Games bronze medalist in 100m hurdles; first Paralympian to set an American record in 800m heptathlon and 1984 American record in 400m hurdles.

Prior to accepting the position at MSU-Moorhead, Sheffield ran Sheffield Elite NFL Football Conditioning as an entrepreneur. He has been working with the National Football League since 1986 as a personal trainer/consultant including Heisman Trophy Winner Cam Newton.



Volleyball Dennis Janzen

Dennis Janzen holds a Ph.D. in the Psychology of Sport and currently is the Director of Athletics at Fresno Pacific University. Formerly the head women's volleyball coach at Fresno Pacific University until 2010, Janzen was the winningest women's coach in all of college volleyball from 2001-2010 with a 373-18 win-loss record. With a career win-loss of 867-168, Janzen's team's also attained win streaks of 121 consecutive home-court victories and 91 straight regular season wins. A six-time national champion and four-time national coach of the year, Janzen's teams had an NAIA record 20 national tournament appearances and appeared for 184 consecutive weeks in the NAIA national "top five" poll including 43 straight weeks ranked #1 nationally. Janzen has also had coaching stints as an assistant men's coach with the U.S. National Team, Penn State University, and the University of Southern California. Topics: Team Culture, Mental Toughness and Winning: Creating and Seizing Opportunities and Restorative Discipline: Turning Problems into Opportunities.



T&F & XC Joe I. Vigil

Joe Vigil, Ph.D., is the legendary guru of American distance running with accomplishments almost beyond belief. Vigil led teams to 12 NAIA National Cross Country Championships and the 1995 NCAA Division II National Cross Country Championship, the last with a perfect score of 15 points. In cross country and track & field, Vigil's teams won a total of 19 national championships. His overall record at Adams State stands at 94.2 percent with 3,014 wins and 176 losses.

Vigil was named National COY on 14 different occasions. He also produced 425 All Americans and 87 individual national champions during his tenure at Adams State.

Vigil has also had success in coaching post-collegiate athletes including 2004 Olympic Marathon Silver Medalist, Deena Drossin Kastor and 2 athletes ranked #1 in the world.

Vigil has been inducted into 11 Halls of Fame. He has served on 17 international coaching staffs including the World Cross Country Championships, the Pan American Games, the World Championships, and the Olympic Games. He was an assistant coach on the 2008 United States Olympic Team, in charge of the distance runners



Wrestling Chris Pendleton

Chris Pendleton is an assistant wrestling coach at the University of Wyoming and has just completed his third year there.

A Lemoore, Calif., product, Chris won NCAA titles at 174 pounds in 2004 and 2005 and was a three-time collegiate All-American (2003-05) while competing for the Oklahoma State Cowboys. He was a member of the OSU squad from 2001-05. He was a leader on three Oklahoma State NCAA championship teams (2003-05), compiled a 118-12 record (91 percent win rate) as a collegian and was a 2006 2012 USA National Team member. He recently was named as one of the 10 best college wrestlers of the 2000s by InterMat Magazine. He was a two-time Big 12 individual champion, claiming titles in 2003 and 2005.



Tennis

Ken DeHart

The Director of Tennis at the San Jose Swim and Racquet Club, Ken was named PTR 2009 International Pro of the year, his third such honor. He is a PTR and US PTA Master Professional, USA High Performance Coach, a National Trainer for Recreational Coaches and a national speaker for Cardio Tennis. Ken is also associate editor for TennisOne.com, on the National Advisory Staff for Tennisdrill.com, a PTR National Tester and a contributing writer for Pro Tennis Magazine.

In addition to the PTR Pro of the Year awards, Ken is a 3X USPTA Career Development Award Winner, 2X USPTA Southwest Pro of the Year and 2X USPTA NorCal Pro of the Year.

Ken has produced 7 outstanding DVD's for tennis instruction and is one of most popular speakers we have ever had at the MCA Clinic.



Softball

Mike Renney

Coach Renney has been at the helm of the SFU Softball program since 1995, and in that time has developed Simon Fraser softball into, not only one of the top college programs in the NAIA, but a top producer of Canadian National Team athletes, including 11 Olympians.

With a winning percentage of over 75% Coach Renney has led the Clan softball team to 14 NAIA National Championship appearances, all of which have resulted in top 10 finishes and have included four National Titles since 1999.

Coach Renney's success on the field has earned him numerous honors including NAIA and NFCA 'Coach of the Year' on three different occasions.

A graduate of the National Coaching Institute with a degree in High Performance Coaching Studies, Renney also holds a Simon Fraser University BA Degree with a major in Psychology and a minor in Kinesiology as well as a Graduate diploma in Business Administration from SFU.

Aside from all of the titles and victories, the ultimate goal is an education and this is one thing that Coach Renney stresses with those in his charge.

Rob, a 32-year head coaching veteran, has led programs at Juniata College, Drake, and MSU to conference Championships and national prominence while maintaining high academic standards. His career record 205-116-5, is in the top 20 among active coaches. This season he led the Bobcats to a Co-Big Sky Championship and was voted Conference COY and Liberty Mutual National COY. He was elected as the President of the American Football Coaches Association in 2010-11.



Cheerleading

Akram Hemaidan

Akram has had the privilege of working with some of the best cheerleading instructors and choreographers in the industry over the years. Akram started his career in High school where he was a member of one of the top teams in the nation which placed high in the finals at UCA nationals. Akram then went on to be part of the 6-Time USA National College Championships Cheer Empire. He was the Captain of this team for four of the six championships and also a Top 3 Finalist at the Worlds Competition in Orlando Florida for two consecutive years.

Since then, Akram has found himself working with teams and programs from all over the world such as The Platinum All Stars, Westcoast All Stars, Cheerforce, Germany, Thailand (Team Bangkok) and Norway National Teams. He has helped many high schools win state and national championships from all over the country.

Akram is currently working as the director for World Class Cheerleading where he coaches several national championship teams and leads safety, tumbling, stunting, and dance clinics for top ranked high school and all star programs from all over the nation. Akram also won best choreography award at NCA Nationals and has been nominated for Coach of the Year for three straight years

Mick Delaney

A veteran mentor, Delaney began his coaching career in 1964. The 2013 season will be his 29th season of coaching football at the collegiate level. He is in his second season as the head football coach at The University of Montana.

He came to Montana from Colorado State where he assisted former head coach Sonny Lubick for 15 seasons. Prior to coaching the Rams, Delaney held the head football and athletic director positions at Western Montana, Dillon. He served as the athletic director at Montana Tech in Butte from 1983-85. He began his coaching career at Butte Central H.S. as head wrestling and assistant football coach. He was head wrestling coach at UM at that time.

He then moved on the Great Falls where he took on assistant wrestling and T & F positions, leading the Bison gridders to a state title in 1974, earning COY recognition to go along with similar honors in wrestling in 1972. Mick is an inaugural inductee in the WMC Sports Hall of Fame, as well as an MCA "Outstanding Contributor".

Mick and his wife Cheri have three children and nine grandchildren. His grandson, Mick, will be playing for the Grizzlies in 2013

John Warren

John is a Butte native and a graduate of the U of M, where he was a member of the golf team. He played golf at Butte High on one of the greatest H.S. teams in Montana history. The Bulldogs won four state titles during the sixties while John was attending Butte High. He is a retired U.S. Army Lt. Colonel and has over 30 years in sales and merchandising.

Warren is a Class A Golf pro and a graduate of the Professional Golf Management program. He was the assistant golf pro at Rose City Golf Club in Portland, and a teaching professional at Rose City and Colwood National Golf Clubs as well as at Ron Grove Golf Schools and Club Green Meadows Golf & Athletic Club in Vancouver, WA. He is an accomplished player and a multi-event winner, including the 1999 Oregon Senior Masters Tournament. He played one year on the national Senior Tour.

Mike Van Diest

In his thirteen years as head coach at Carroll College, Mike Van Diest has led the Fighting Saints to six National Championships and twelve straight Frontier Conference Championship titles for one of the most dominating runs in college football history. The Saints have posted a 157-22 record during the past thirteen seasons. This includes a Frontier Conference mark of 105-11 for an impressive winning percentage of 92%. Over the past 11 years the Fighting Saints have a remarkable 138-11 record for a winning percentage of 94%. The Saints have compiled a playoff record of 36-6 over the past twelve years. In 2011 the Saints reached the National Championship game for the 8th time in 10 years. During his tenure as head coach Van Diest has been named Frontier Conference Coach of the Year nine times.

Van Diest is a 1970 graduate of Helena High School. His career has included stops at his alma mater, the University of Wyoming, the University of Montana, the University of Massachusetts, and the Big Ten representative, Northwestern University, as an assistant coach. He and his wife Heidi have two sons, Shane, 25 and Clay, 18



Track & Field

Harry Clark

Harry Clark, former University of Houston and Montana State standout and 12 year assistant at U of M, just completed his 1st season as the head coach of the newly reinstated Carroll Track Program.

As a collegiate athlete Clark competed at the University of Houston and Montana State University, qualifying four times for the NCAA championships in the decathlon. His highest finish was fourth at the 1989 national meet. Clark also competed at the 1987 U.S. Olympic Festival, where he had a third-place showing in the decathlon.

Clark still holds the Montana State University record in the decathlon with 7,633 points.

As a prep at Cascade (Mont.) High, Clark was an 11-time state champion in track & field. He still holds the all-time, all-class state record in the triple jump (48-2) and the Class B record in the 110-meter hurdles (14.54) and 300-meter hurdles (38.1).

Clark and his wife, Lori, have two sons, Dexter and Cole.

Rachele Sayers

Prior to her arrival at Carroll in May of 2011, Rachele spent the previous 14 seasons at Weber State University in Ogden, Utah including the last five as the associate head coach.

During her time at Weber State the Wildcats won a pair of Big Sky regular season titles and two Conference Tournament Championships to earn two trips to the NCAA National Tournament.

Rachele was a four-year standout at Weber State and a two-year starter from 1993-96, playing for Coach Carla Taylor. She led the Wildcats in scoring her junior year with 14.9 points per game and was named to the Big Sky All-Conference First Team. The second leading scorer her senior year (11.8 ppg), she helped lead the Wildcats to a second place finish at the Big Sky Championship and earned All-Conference honors for the second straight season. Rachele is currently the 14th all-time leading scorer in Wildcat history with 1,009 career points. She ranks fifth in Weber State history in career three-pointers made with 149 and is ninth in school history in three-point percentage at .323

Rachele is a native of Absarokee, Montana. Rachele is married to Keith Sayers and they are the proud parents of two daughters, Keetyn, age 8, Taylor, age 5, and twin boys, Reddic and Rieker, who are 2.

Don Mast

Don Mast has the distinction of being the longest tenured men's college coach in the state of Montana. Coach Mast started his coaching career in 1980, at Winifred where he served as basketball, football and track coach. In his spare time he was the Activities Director and taught classes. In 1985, he moved to White Sulphur Springs where he served as Head Basketball and Football Coach for 5 years.

In 1990, Don became the Head Men's Basketball Coach at Dawson Community College in Glendive. In the past 23 years he has guided his team to 415 wins while competing in the very competitive Region XI. During that time his teams have played in 5 quarter finals, 3 semi-finals and one championship. Don has a remarkable, 567-393 career record.

Terry Graham concluded his career at CM Russell High School in 2001 with a career record of 226-90. As the inaugural coach at CMR, in 12 years he won 5 straight State Championships from 1997-2001 with 2 second place finishes. He was a 5-time Coach of the Year and is a member of the MCA Hall-of-Fame. Terry is highly respected in coaching circles and regarded as one of the finest baseball minds in the state. Jim Stanton

Jim began his coaching career as an assistant in the storied FB program at Baker, then at Forsyth before moving on to Huntley Project. He served as the Red Devil head mentor from 1993-2001, earning a State Championship in 1998 and runner-up honors in 1999.

Coach Stanton began his remarkable run at Billings Central in 2002 where he has led the Rams to 6 straight Class A Championship appearances, winning the title in 2007 and 2012. His teams have won 7 consecutive Eastern A Championships and made 10 straight play-off appearances. The 2012 Billings Central team was recognized nationally by Max Preps as a Top-50 Team. Coach Stanton will be inducted into the MCA Hall of Fame this year. He will speak on "Practice Planning" and "Rams Defense".

Scott King

Scott resigned as the Head Football Coach at Malta High School after the 2012 season. He had 28 years as a head grid coach, 4 at Harlem and 24 with Malta. His over-all record was 216-71 including a 206-48 record at Malta. In his 24 years at Malta the Mustangs qualified for the play-offs all 24 years advancing to the state championship game 7 times, winning 3. They also captured 15 conference championships. Scott was named MCA Coach of the Year 3 times and in 2012 was inducted into the Montana Coaches Association Hall of Fame. Scott served the on the MCA Board of Directors for 10 years including two years as president during 2009 and 2010. Scott will speak on "Developing Senior Leadership".



Wrestling

Steve Komac

Steve Komac, head coach of the Great Falls High Wrestling Team is a native of Havre, Montana. He is a graduate of Havre HS and MSU Northern where he competed collegiately. Steve got his coaching start in Browning, MT where he spent 6 enjoyable years and coached two state champions and several state-placers. Coach Komac moved to Great Falls in 2001, taking the assistant wrestling job at GFHS. In 2004 he took the helm as the Bison Head Wrestling Coach.

Komac has led the "Thundering Herd" to six top-3 finishes in the past seven years. In 2013 they claimed the State AA Championship.

Keith Chambers

Keith is a 24 year veteran of the coaching wars. 22 of those years have been at Stevensville, where he has built one of the most respected programs in the Class A ranks. During his tenure at the helm of the Yellow Jackets, his teams have earned 7 Divisional Championships and 5 State Championship appearances, culminating in a State Championship this past year and earning coach Chambers Coach of the Year honors. He has a 325-256 career record.

Arie Grey

An All-State three sport athlete at Powell Co. H.S. in football, basketball and track, Arie Grey is a name very familiar to anyone associated with Montana athletics. In his senior year Arie set the State B record in the 100 meter @ 11.01 and the 400 meter @ 48.2, the latter still standing at this writing.

Grey continued his outstanding athletic career at MSU in Bozeman. While competing for the Bobcats, Arie was a two sport athlete, almost unheard of in today's world of specialization. As a 4 year letterman in both Football and Track, he was selected by teammates as captain in both sports his senior year.

His coaching career began in 2003 at Flathead High as an assistant football coach. He took the Butte High head football job in 2008, leading the Bulldogs to the playoffs 3 of those 5 years. They won the State AA Football title against Bozeman, in what may have been the most exciting AA Championship game in history—a culmination of years of hard work and dedication.

In addition to being named Coach of the Year, Coach Grey will also serve as the Head Coach of the 2013 Montana vs. North Dakota Game as well as mentoring the West for the Montana East-West Shrine Game.



Volleyball

Jeff Carroll

Jeff Carroll has been the head coach at Billings Senior High School since 1987. During that time his teams have won 12 conference championships, 10 state championships, and 5 runners-up finishes. He has been named Montana Coach of the Year 10 times, was named to the Montana Coaches Hall of Fame in 2009 and was selected as the NHSACA National Volleyball Coach of the Year in 2010. 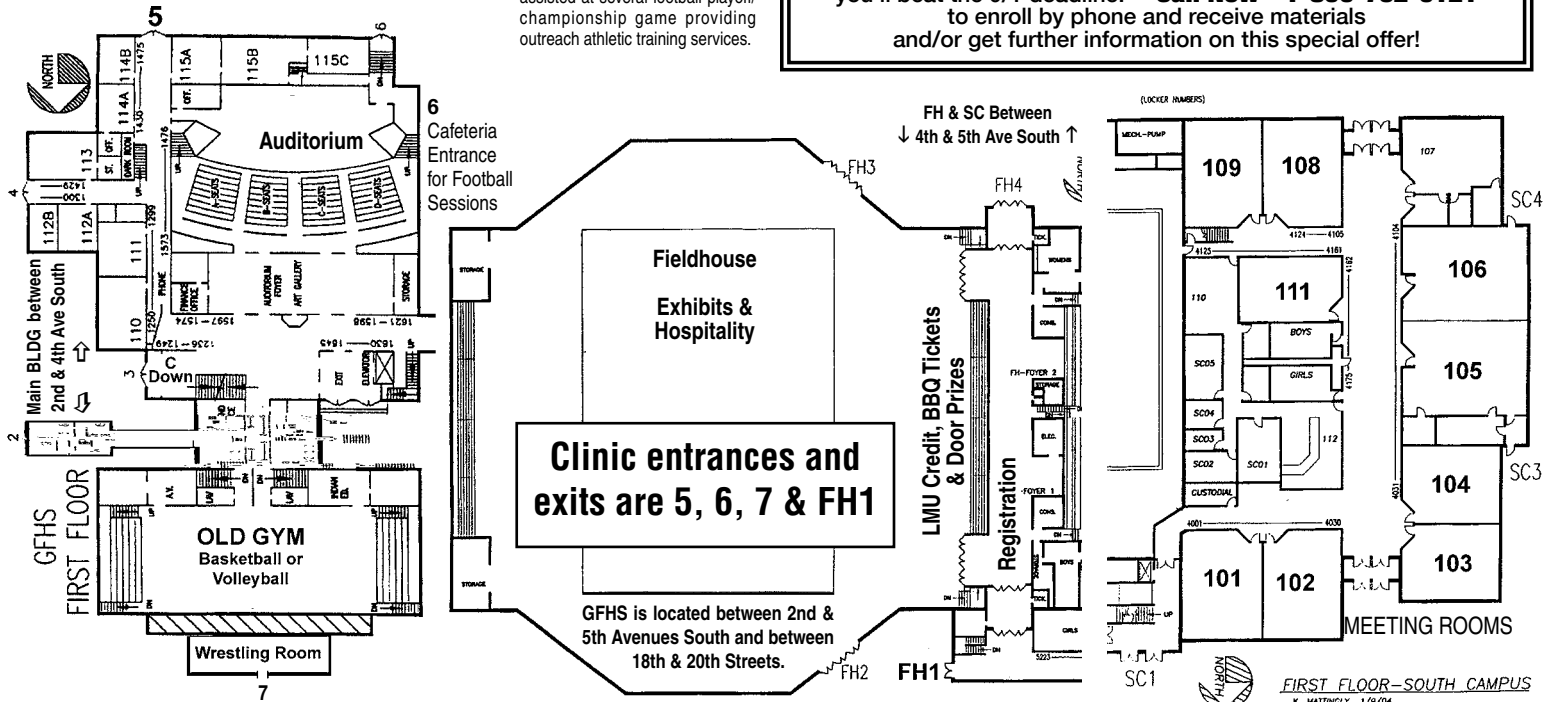
