John McCarthy has been involved in various capacities within college athletics for the past 20 years. At the collegiate level, he's been a Head Coach (Wilmington College, DE), Athletic Director (Lynn University), Founder of the Collegiate Basketball Invitational and Director of the NIAA's Division I Men's Basketball National Championship.



Football

Ron Lynn

After serving as Stanford's assistant head coach and co-defensive coordinator for the 2008 and 2009 seasons, Ron Lynn is in his fourth year as the program's director of player development.

One of the most respected defensive minds in the game, Lynn's long line of experience includes holding defensive coordinator positions with the San Diego Chargers (1986-91), Cincinnati Bengals (1992-93) and Washington Redskins (1994-96). He was a secondary coach in the NFL with the New England Patriots (1997-99), Oakland Raiders (2000-03) and San Francisco 49ers (2004).

Lynn got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant at Toledo in 1966 before returning to his alma mater, Mount Union, where he coached from 1967-73. He then moved to coaching positions at Kent State (1974-76), San Jose State (1977-78), Pacific (1979) and California (1980-82), where he served as defensive coordinator. His first professional coaching position was with Oakland Invaders of the USFL (1983-85).



BB & Motivation

Shanna Zolman

Shanna's biography reads like a Who's Who in women's basketball. She was the 2002 Indiana "Miss Basketball", the all-time leading scorer in Indiana High School and holds the all-time consecutive free throw record at 70. She also led the state in scoring all four years of prep school.

Shanna played for Tennessee's legendary Coach Pat Summitt, making 3 Final Four appearances, leading to 2 National Championship games. While at the University of Tennessee, she set the all-time career record for "made 3 pointers" and set the NCAA free throw percentage record at 91.2%.

In 2009-10 Zolman played internationally in Slovakia and Turkey. She returned to the U.S. and played one year for WNBA's Tulsa Shock and then spent 4 years with the San Antonio Silver Spurs. Shanna will speak on player development (guards) and "Playing for Pat Summitt". On Thursday she will tell her story at the 5:00 motivational session.

Shanna is currently involved full-time with Fellowship of Christian Athletes. She will speak at the Thursday morning FCA Breakfast.



Cheerleading

Akram Hemaidan

Hemaidan is back by popular demand after a well-received presentation last year. Akram started his career in high school where he was a member of one of the top teams in the nation at UCA Nationals. Akram then went on to be Captain of the 6-Time USA National College Champions, Cheer Empire. He has also made dozens of trips to Cheer Worlds as cheerleader, coach and choreographer. Akram also won best choreography award at NCA Nationals and has been nominated for Coach of the Year for three straight years.

Akram is currently working as the Director for World Class Cheerleading where he and an amazing staff lead safety, tumbling, stunting, and dance clinics for pop-warner, junior high, high school and all-star programs from all over the nation.



Volleyball

Jen Greeny

Jen Greeny, in her third season at the helm of the Washington State University volleyball program, made significant progress in rebuilding the program to national prominence. The Cougars produced an 18-win season with five conference wins in 2013, the most wins since the 2009 season.

As the head volleyball coach at Lewis-Clark State College from 2007-10, Greeny accumulating an impressive 112-24 record (.824) while turning the Warriors' program into one of the premier NIAA teams. They won four consecutive Frontier Conference regular season titles and four consecutive berths to the NIAA National Tournament. The Warriors finished in the top 13 in the nation each year and ended the 2010 season at 31-3 (.912), the best mark in the history of the program. Greeny was a four-time Frontier Conference Coach of the Year and the American Volleyball Coaches' Association's Northwest Region Coach of the Year.



Volleyball

LaToya Harris

LaToya Harris enters her fourth year as the head coach at Lewis-Clark State College. A former Frontier Conference Coach of the Year, Harris was a standout player at WSU under Jen Greeny.

Harris was a standout volleyball player at Parkrose High School in Portland where she earned 12 letters and was a starter in all three sports for four seasons. She signed to play volleyball at WSU where she was a starter all four seasons and earned All-Freshman Pac-10 Conference honors her first season and first-team All-Pac-10 her final three seasons. She was the team MVP her sophomore and senior seasons and earned Pac-10 Player of the Week both seasons as well. Harris also helped WSU to the NCAA tournament her final three seasons with an Elite Eight appearance in 2002. She became the third player in WSU history to record at least 1,000 kills and 1,000 digs during her career and finished fourth in school history in both categories. She also held the record for most career service aces with 143.



Football

Jeff Choate

Jeff Choate was named defensive line coach and special teams coordinator for the U of W Huskies in December, 2013. He reunited with Chris Petersen after spending the previous two seasons at Florida and Washington State.

In 2013, Choate served as special teams coordinator and outside linebackers coach at Florida. The Gators ranked second in the SEC in total defense (314.2) and pass defense (171.8), while they ranked third in rush defense (142.4) and points allowed (21.1). He joined Florida in April after spending the spring as defensive coordinator at UTEP

Choate served as linebackers coach at Washington State in 2012. The Cougars were eighth nationally in tackles for loss (7.7 per game) and 11th in sacks (2.9 per game).

From 2006-2011, Choate was an assistant at Boise State in several roles. Prior to joining Boise State, Choate served as special teams coach at Eastern Illinois and Utah State. In his lone season at Eastern Illinois, the Panthers finished first in the Ohio Valley Conference.

Choate earned his bachelor's degree from Western Montana in 1993, where he played linebacker and went on to coach the same position for the Bulldogs.

Dave Kapp

Dave Kapp, CMAA, is the Athletic Director at Madison East High School in Madison, WI. East is an urban school of almost 1800 students, offering 25 varsity sports.

Kapp went to college at the University of Wisconsin - Whitewater and received a BSE in English Writing and Coaching Athletics. He then earned an MSED in Special Education. Later, he earned a second MSED in Curriculum & Instruction.

Dave played and coached football, basketball and baseball. He has been an athletic director for 15 years. He is married (wife Tammy) and has two children, Jake and Amanda.

Mike Neighbors

Mike Neighbors was promoted to head coach in at the University of Washington in 2013, leading the Huskies to a deep run in the WNIT. As a result of this outstanding first season, he was named a finalist for the 2014 Spalding Maggie Dixon Award, which is given to a successful DI first year coach. He had previously worked as the top assistant coach under Kevin McGuff for two seasons with the Huskies. The 44-year-old Neighbors helped the Huskies to a second-straight 20-win season and a return trip to the WNIT. Washington finished 21-12, including 11-7 in the Pac-12, good for a fifth-place finish.

Neighbors is regarded as one of the country's best defensive and player-development specialists. His accomplishments in women's basketball speak for themselves. He's helped sign eight McDonald's All-Americans, seen eight of his players drafted in the WNBA, including three who have won WNBA Championships. Coach Neighbors' weekly newsletter is popular with coaches at all levels.



T&F - Throws

Nathan Fanger

Coach Fanger, a Kalispell native has coached many champions and is respected nationwide as one of the top throwing coaches.

With the Kent State program already widely regarded for success in those events, Fanger has taken the team to new heights during his tenure on the coaching staff. Under his guidance, 40 throwers have won MAC championships, 34 have qualified for NCAA Regional meets, 19 have qualified for the NCAA Championships and six have earned All-America status.

Fanger has aided the Golden Flashes in capturing 11 MAC team championships.

Fanger, a 2000 graduate of Kent State, was a standout athlete for the Golden Flashes in his own right. He is the only four-time discus champion in MAC history. Twice he qualified for the NCAA championships in the discus and he holds the Kent State school record in the event with a throw of 194'-3."



Basketball

Mick Durham

Mick Durham's name is synonymous with Montana Basketball. Following an outstanding high school career at Three Forks, he began his coaching career at Shepherd HS. He then served 8 years as an assistant at MSU, taking over the helm of the Bobcats in 1991.

Durham is a former point guard (4th all-time in assists and FT% at Montana State). He coached at his alma mater for 16 seasons, notching a Big Sky Conference record 246 wins and winning the conference Coach of the Year award three times (1996, 2002, and 2005). He also led the MSU Bobcats to a pair of Big Sky titles and a berth in the 1996 NCAA Tournament. Mick has the second most victories and the second longest tenure in MSU history. After taking a two-year hiatus from coaching, he returned as an assistant at New Mexico State for a 3 year stint.

Coach Durham took over the helm of the UAF in 2011 and went 5-23 his first year with a team he inherited. In year two, Durham recruited a team that made one of the biggest turnarounds in DII hoops history recording a 16-12 winning season. In his third season the Nanooks achieved an 18-10 record. He has been one of our most popular clinicians and we are pleased to bring him back.



Wrestling

Steve Sanderson

A three-time Utah Wrestling COY and Hall of Fame member, Steve Sanderson is a living legend in the wrestling world. His teams have won 11 Utah State Championships and he has coached 79 individual state champions. Steve's high school coaching record is a remarkable 419 wins, 24 losses and 2 ties.

Sanderson's 4 sons own 14 HS state wrestling titles and over 500 wins for Iowa State and Penn State. Son, Cael won the Olympic Gold in 2004, preceded by an undefeated college career (159-0) and 4 NCAA titles.

Football
Mick Delaney

Coach Delaney began his coaching career in 1964. The 2014 season will be his 30th coaching football at the collegiate level. He is in his third year as the head football coach at the U of M.

Mick came to Montana from Colorado State where he assisted former head coach Sonny Lubick for 15 seasons. Prior to coaching the Rams, Delaney held the head football and athletic director positions at Western Montana College in Dillon.

He served as the athletic director at Montana Tech in Butte from 1983-85. He began his coaching career at Butte Central H.S. as head wrestling and assistant football coach.

He then moved on the Great Falls, leading the Bison gridders to a state title in 1974, earning COY recognition to go along with similar honors in wrestling in 1972. Mick is an inaugural inductee in the WMC Sports Hall of Fame, as well as an MCA "Outstanding Contributor".

Mick and his wife Cheri have three children and nine grandchildren. Their grandson, Mick, plays for the Grizzlies.



Softball
Aaron Jackson

Coach Jackson begins his first season at Carroll College in 2014. He was selected as the first softball coach in Carroll College history. Prior to Carroll, Jackson was the head coach at Eastern Oregon University where his team showed steady improvement throughout his three seasons. At Eastern Oregon, Coach Jackson's teams were ranked in the top 25 in team GPA each year.

Jackson was an Assistant Coach at MSU-B for three seasons where his main duties were academic and compliance monitoring in accordance with NCAA Division II regulations, recruiting qualified student athletes from the west region, as well as practice and game coaching, specializing in outfield instruction.

Prior to Montana State University Billings, Jackson was the Head Junior Varsity Coach and Assistant Varsity Coach at Sentinel High School in Missoula, MT for four years. He also has five years of experience coaching numerous summer ASA teams.

Football
Rob Ash

The work of Ash and his staff has resulted in 57 wins over seven seasons (Ash's record at MSU is 57-27), and the 30 wins from 2010-12 marks the most wins and second-highest winning percentage over such a stretch in school history. Ash now stands 233-126-5 in his 34 seasons as a college head coach, with that win total standing sixth among active college coaches and 33rd all-time. He is just one of five Bobcat coaches to bring multiple championships to MSU, and one of just three with three titles to his credit.

Winning championships is nothing new for Ash - he now owns eight. Montana State's 2012 crown stands as the program's sixth in the last 11 years, matching the most successful decade in program history in terms of championships. Ash's 50 wins place him alone in Montana State's legendary coaching family.



T&F
Bill Halverson

Bill was Montana's first High School 15' vaulter in 1975, broke the state record all three years at GFHS and nationally ranked in 1976 with bests of 15-7 1/2 indoors at Pocatello and 15-9 outdoors at the Golden West Invitational. He is a member of the MHSA Athletes Hall of Fame.

As a collegian he simultaneously held the school vault record at UM, MT SAC & San Diego State with marks of 16-9, 17-1 and 17-6. He will be vaulting in the National Masters (50-54) meet in Spokane, on Sunday Aug 10th. He's a 4X masters champion and a 2X National Masters Field Event Athlete of the Year.



Softball
Joey Egan

Joey Egan enters her third year heading up the UGF Softball Team, after assisting for 4 seasons. She played for MSUB where she earned numerous awards, including MSU-B's Female Athlete of the Year and the Little Sullivan Award in 2005 and the 2011 MSU-B Hall of Fame.



XC & Track
Bill Brist

In the span of twenty-one years, Bill has achieved numerous accomplishments coaching at the Collegiate, Junior College and High School levels. He is entering his third year as the Head Coach of the Cross Country and Track & Field programs at UGF. In his first 2 years, he has had 11 athletes qualify for the NAIA National Championships in XC and T&F. He spent 8 seasons at Flathead Valley CC, the eagles placed in the top ten at the NJCAA National Championships on three occasions, with four All-Americans, and a NJCAA National Individual Champion.



Soft Ball
Gary Ehnes

Gary Ehnes is in his fourth year as the Argos Athletic Director. Before his tenure as athletic director, Ehnes was responsible for bringing fast pitch softball to the university and was the first Head Coach for the Lady Argos' program. While he oversees all athletic teams at the University of Great Falls, he still enjoys serving as an assistant softball coach for his daughter, Head Coach Joey Egan. He has been a part of the softball community in Great Falls for over 30 years as a player, sponsor, tournament sponsor, and coach.



Golf
Brittany Basye

Basye's 2011 arrival to MSU marks her second stint with the Bobcats. The Billings native was the head coach from 2000-2007 and served as an assistant in 1999-2000.

While at Montana State, she coached three All-Big Sky Conference players and 24 All-Big Sky Academic selections.

Prior to MSU, Basye competed in the Players West Women's Mini Tour. She had the privilege of competing in the US Women's Open Championship in 1995 and the US Women's Amateur Championship in 1993, where she was a semifinalist.

Basketball
Brian Fish

Brian Fish, an NCAA Division I coaching veteran of a quarter-century known for the dual abilities to both recruit and help build programs, became Montana State University's 22nd men's basketball head coach on April 1, 2012.

Fish joined the Bobcats after serving as an assistant at the University of Oregon. His time with the Ducks marked the continuation of a long-standing relationship with one of college basketball's most respected coaches, Dana Altman. Brian's 4th season on Altman's staff culminated in a round-of-32 loss to Wisconsin. He has 21 years of experience coaching at the Division I level and has spent 15 of his 25 years in coaching with Altman at Oregon, Kansas State, Creighton and Marshall as well as stops at San Diego under Brad Holland, TCU with Billy Tubbs.

In his 18 seasons as an assistant coach Fish's team has advanced to the post-season 12 times, including five NCAA appearances. Those teams have reached the 20-win mark on 13 occasions.

We welcome Coach Fish to the Big Sky Country. This is an excellent opportunity for coaches to get acquainted with him and his staff.



Basketball
Bill Dreikosen

Coach Bill Dreikosen is entering his 15th season as the head coach of the Battlin' Bears. In 2008-2009, RMC finished with a 28-9 record and were the NAIA Division I National Champions. Coach Dreikosen was named NAIA National Coach of the Year in 2009. The Bear's championship was the first in men's basketball by any team from the Frontier Conference in the history of the league.

During his tenure at RMC, Coach Dreikosen has an overall record of 242-203. His teams have advanced to the NAIA National Tournament five times and they won Frontier Conference Tournament Championships in 2003, 2004, 2013 and 2014. He was awarded "Frontier COY" honors for his success this past season.

Wrestling
Tyson Thivierge

Coach Thivierge currently finished his 6th season as Head Wrestling Coach at MSU-Northern. For a second consecutive season his Lights placed 3rd at the NAIA National Wrestling Tournament. During his six seasons, Coach Thivierge has produced 23 NAIA All-Americans, 2 National Champions and 3 Academic All-Americans.

Thivierge originally comes from Clarkston, WA, and competed from 1998-2002 at MSU-Northern. While at Northern, Thivierge compiled a record of 136-29, was a 4-time NAIA All-American placing 3rd, 2nd, 3rd and became a National Champion and Outstanding Wrestler in 2002. He became only the 2nd ever 4x All-American in MSU-Northern team history. He was also a member of the 1999 and 2000 NAIA National Championship teams.



Football
Pete Stanton

Pete Stanton will enter his first season as head football coach at Dickinson State where he has assisted for 14 years. During that time the Blue Hawks won eight conference football championships and appeared in eleven NAIA play-off games. The Baker native started his coaching career at Terry in 1989, leading the program to the playoffs nine consecutive years, a 70-20 record, and three state championship appearances. Stanton will special on defensive and special team's drills.



Golf
Joni Stephens

Joni Stephens is the new women's golf coach at the University of Montana.

Stephens coached the Eastern Kentucky Colonels from 1998 to 2010 and had back-to-back second-place finishes at the Ohio Valley Conference championships in 2005 and '06. She was named the 2005 OVC coach of the year. Joni and her husband Pat were co-owners of Stephens Golf from 1990-2008.

In Stephens' 12-year career, the Colonels won four tournaments and had five individual champions.



Wrestling
Caleb Schaeffer

Caleb Schaeffer enters his fifth year as the head coach of the Argonaut wrestling program. Since taking over the reins of the program, Schaeffer has continued the tradition of excellence to which Argo wrestling fans have grown accustomed. In his first three seasons, Schaeffer has led his team to one first place (2008) and two runners-up (2009 & 2010) finishes at the NAIA Western Regional Tournament, as well as national finishes of 4th (2008), 12th (2009) and 3rd (2010).

He was a four-time All-American at Montana State University-Northern. He still holds records for the most wins (165) and most pins (85) in MSU-Northern history.



Tennis
Jan Steenkamp

Jan Steenkamp, Head Tennis Pro. comes to Meadow Lark from Missoula where he had been a teaching pro for six years. Prior to teaching in Missoula he served as assistant coach at EWU as well as the U of M.

During his playing days Jan was ranked the number one Junior doubles player in South Africa, and no. 6 in singles. During college he was a three time Big Sky Conference first team selection while playing no. 1 singles at UM, and was an All Southland Conference selection at The University of Louisiana - Monroe.



Golf
Pat Stephens

Pat Stephens is in his 17th year at the helm of the Eastern Kentucky men's golf program, having led the Colonels to unprecedented success in that time. During his tenure, the Colonels have placed in the top 10 at 163 events while finishing in the top five at 110 of those competitions.

As a collegiate golfer, Pat played for the University of Kentucky Golf Team for two years before transferring to Eastern Kentucky University.

Stephens and his wife Joni, who co-authored the book "Skills, Drills and Strategies for Golf" will head up the Thursdays golf sessions.

Dustin Gordon, head girls' basketball coach at Fairfield High School, just finished his 4th undefeated season and is currently on a state record 104 game winning streak that includes 4 state championships.

Gordon just finished his 8th year coaching in Fairfield, following 3 years in Chester. Over that 11 year span, Coach Gordon's overall record stands at 256 - 33 and includes: 6 State Championships, 2 State Runner-Ups, and one 3rd place finish.

8-Man Football
Jay Fredrickson

Coach Fredrickson, 2013 MCA 8-Man Football COY, took the reins of the Ennis Mustang Football program six years ago. As head coach his record is 41 wins and 19 losses with two semi-final appearances and a class C 8-man State Championship this past year. For the past 38 years Coach Fred has been involved with the greatest of games as a player, assistant or head coach. He missed the 1990-91 season to fulfill a commitment with the US Marine Corps Reserve for Operation Desert Shield / Desert Storm and to marry his wife, Dannette.

Carmen Harbach

In her ten years as head volleyball coach at Gardiner High School, Carmen Harbach has led the Bruins to 5 state tournament appearances, earning 3rd place in 2009 and 2010 and state champion honors in 2012 and 2013. A graduate of Billings West, she went on to play four years of volleyball at Eastern Montana College while earning a degree in Elementary Education. Carmen and her husband, Brad, are the proud of parents of two children, Ryan (21), and Kelly (18). She is a two time Coach of the Year recipient, and this is her first time speaking at the clinic, where she will focus on "Team Building"



Football
Troy Purcell

Three-time MCA COY, Purcell has been a head coach for the past 23 years at 4 districts and 3 different classifications, winning 3 State Championships, 2 State Runner ups, 4 semi finals, and 8 Conference-District-Divisional titles. He is one of the few Montana coaches whose teams have won a State Championship at 2 different schools at 2 different levels. The first was at Havre in 2004; their first championship in 34 years. The second and third were at Bozeman. The first came in 2010, when the Hawks finished with a 13-0 season and their first ever football championship followed by their 2nd championship in 2013, and another perfect 13-0 record.

Troy has coached in five Shrines, two MonDaks and four Class-B All Star games.



Cross Country
Clint May

Coach May has led both his Bozeman High Boys' and Girls' Cross Country Teams to state championships in 2012 and 2013. This fall will be his 9th season as the Hawks Head Coach. One of the highlights over the past 8 years includes the 2012 boys' team, who were blessed to capture the State title after a season of steady progression where they had not won an invitational in the regular season. From the girls' side, being able to compete at the National meet and place in the top half stands as a highlight.



T & F -Hurdles
Lon Carter

Lon started coaching in 1964 with stops at Cody, Wyoming, University of Wyoming, and Gillette, Wyoming. In 1969, he moved to Helena, where he helped with the start of Capital High School. He has coached football, basketball, and track. He is now the Head Boys Track and Field Coach at Capital High School. Few state meets have passed without one of Lon's Bruin hurdlers on the awards stand. He will talk about the 110m and 300m Hurdles; preparation for the season; and drills to improve your athletes.



Volleyball
Christy Harkins

Christy played high school volleyball and softball at Snohomish High School in Snohomish, WA, and then collegiate volleyball at Western Washington University. She began her coaching career at Bridgeport, WA, moved to Columbia Falls where she won a state championship in 1996, then moved to Flathead High in 2002, where she won several conference championships and a 2nd and 3rd place state finish. She left Flathead in 2007 to help open Glacier High School and start the volleyball program there. Coach Harkins has proudly led the Wolfpack to 2 conference titles, 5 State tournament appearances, and a third place State finish in Glacier's 7 years.



T & F
John Sillitti

John Sillitti has coached distance and mid-distance runners in track and CC for 14 years. Manhattan's boys track teams have finished in the top three at state for six straight years and have won four of the last six state championships. Runners coached by Sillitti have earned 18 individual state championships, 13 runner-up finishes, and over 80 total state medals. Sillitti is a 4 time MCA COY.

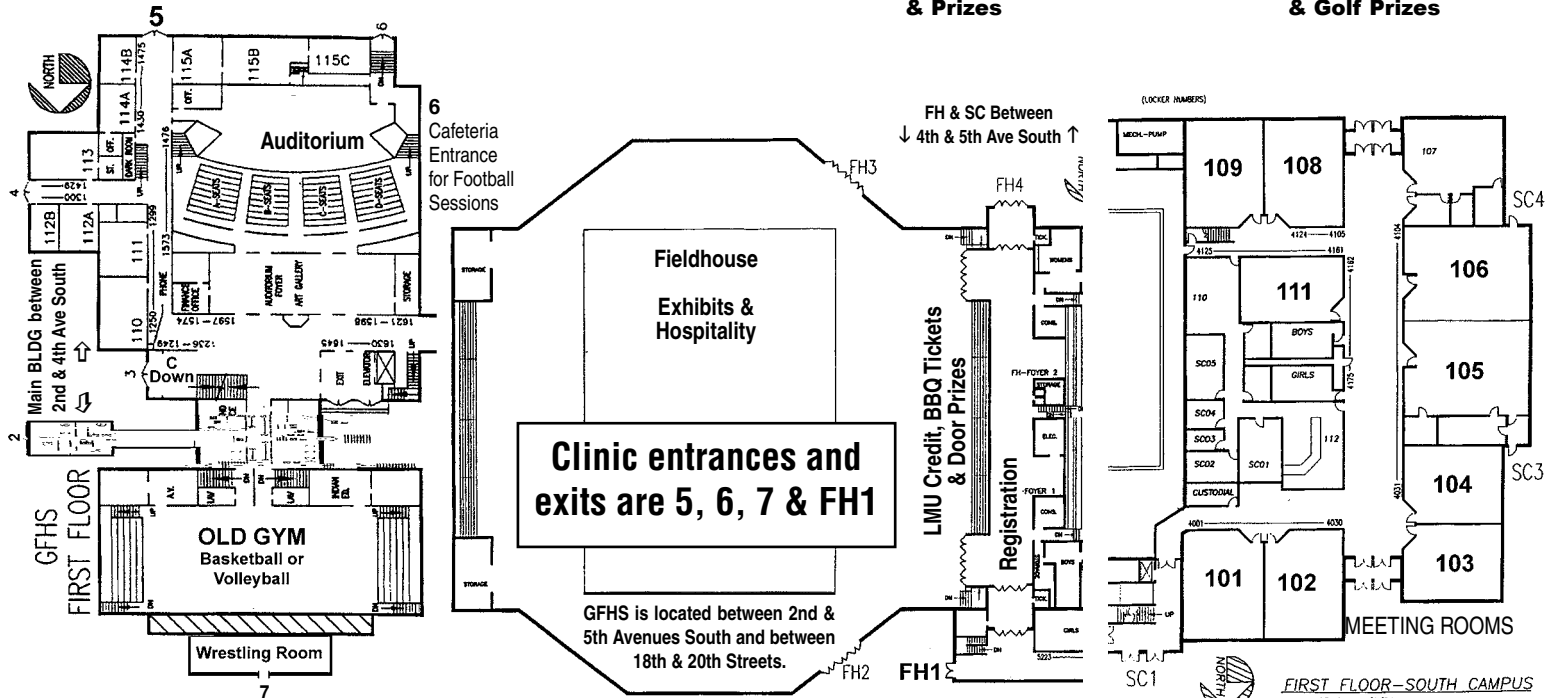
